

# DAR, SABER, and CONOCER

**DAR** is an irregular verb meaning **to give**.  
It has a conjugation similar to **IR**:

## dar - to give

doy	damos
das	dais
da	dan



**Doy la tarta a mis amigos.**

I give the pie to my friends.

**¿Da Pepe los libros a Susana?**

Does Pepe give the books to Susana?

**SABER** and **CONOCER** both mean **to know**.

They have irregular yo forms, but the rest of their conjugation is regular.  
Follow the rules below to know which verb to use.

## saber - to know

sé	sabemos
sabes	sabéis
sabe	saben

## conocer - to know

conozco	conocemos
conoces	conocéis
conoce	conocen

1. Saber means **to know a fact**.
2. Before an infinitive verb, saber means **to know how to do something**.
3. Conocer means **to be acquainted with a person, place, or thing**.
4. Conocer can also mean **to meet someone for the first time**.

**No sé mucho de Brasil.**

I don't know much about Brazil.

**Tienes que conocer a Tomás.**

You have to meet Thomas.

**Conozco a Claudia, pero no sé dónde está.**

I know Claudia, but I don't know where she is.
