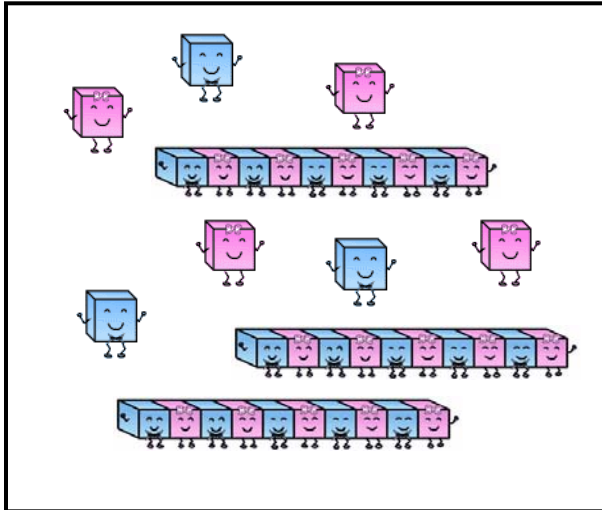


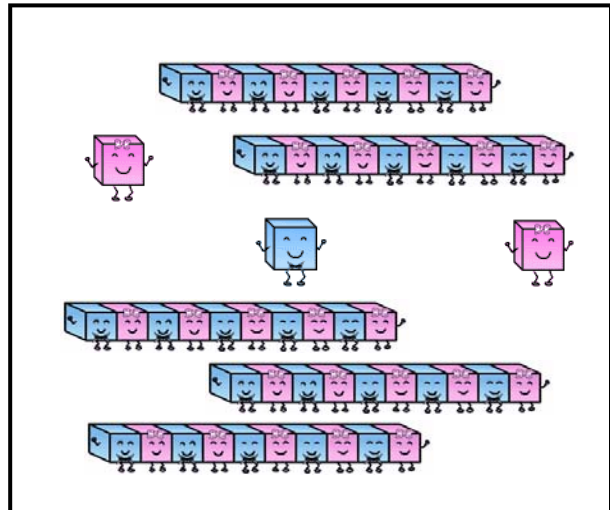
Tens and Ones

Sometimes when we count, there are single cubes left over after we make all our groups of ten. To find out how many cubes we have, first we count the tens: "10, 20, 30, 40..." Then we count the ones, starting where we left off: "...41, 42, 43, 44, 45."

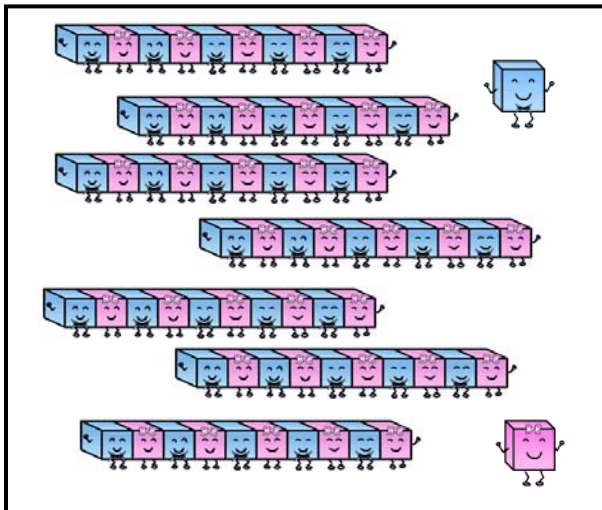
Count the rows of ten and single cubes, then write how many cubes there are altogether.



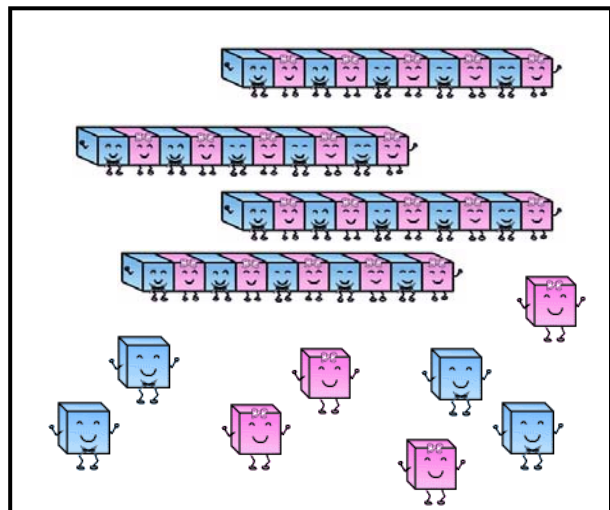
